Subject: On-Campus Employment of International Students in F-1 or J-1 immigration status

during Winter Vacation

This is a reminder message for the campus community regarding on-campus employment of international students. Due to confusion on these issues, International Student Services (ISS) has worked with Payroll, the Office of Graduate and Professional Studies (OGAPS), and the Registrar to clarify the information and to provide answers to frequently asked questions.

WORKING MORE THAN 20 HOURS PER WORK WEEK DURING WINTER VACATION 2016

According to federal regulations, international students "may work on campus full-time when school is not in session, or during the annual vacation" 8 C.F.R. 214(f)(9)(i).

Students may be able to start working more than 20 hours/week at **12:01 AM (midnight) immediately after** the first day of Fall 2016 Commencement.

Students will have to stop working more than 20 hours/week at **11:59 PM (midnight) immediately before** the first day of classes of Spring 2017.

Please note that Commencement dates and First Day of Classes may <u>vary depending on the campus and professional college</u>. See the table below for specific dates for each entity.

Please be aware that the repercussions for an international student who is in violation of employment rules are serious. A student who works more than 20 hours/week when not legally eligible to do so loses his/her non-immigrant status and is considered to have unlawful presence in the United States. Students will need to meet with an ISS advisor to determine the steps to regain their lawful status.
